

Texas Cotton Association Meeting Held in Galveston

The Texas Cotton Association (TCA) held its 91st Annual Convention on Galveston Island at Moody Gardens in April.

The Port of Galveston co-sponsored the welcoming reception for delegates from the cotton industry from throughout the U.S. Other co-sponsors included Moody Compress and Warehouse, Southern Compress and Warehouse and Moody Bank.

The Port of Galveston also co-hosted the Transportation Industry Reception for shippers, stevedores and trucking line representatives from the Galveston/Houston area.

The Port of Galveston continues to market the port facilities to the cotton industry. Staff continues to provide warehousing space for the storage and shipment of cotton. Galveston is one of five delivery points in the United States for certificated cotton on the New York Cotton Exchange.

The Texas Cotton Association was organized in 1911 and held the first annual convention in Galveston in 1912 at the Galvez Hotel.
